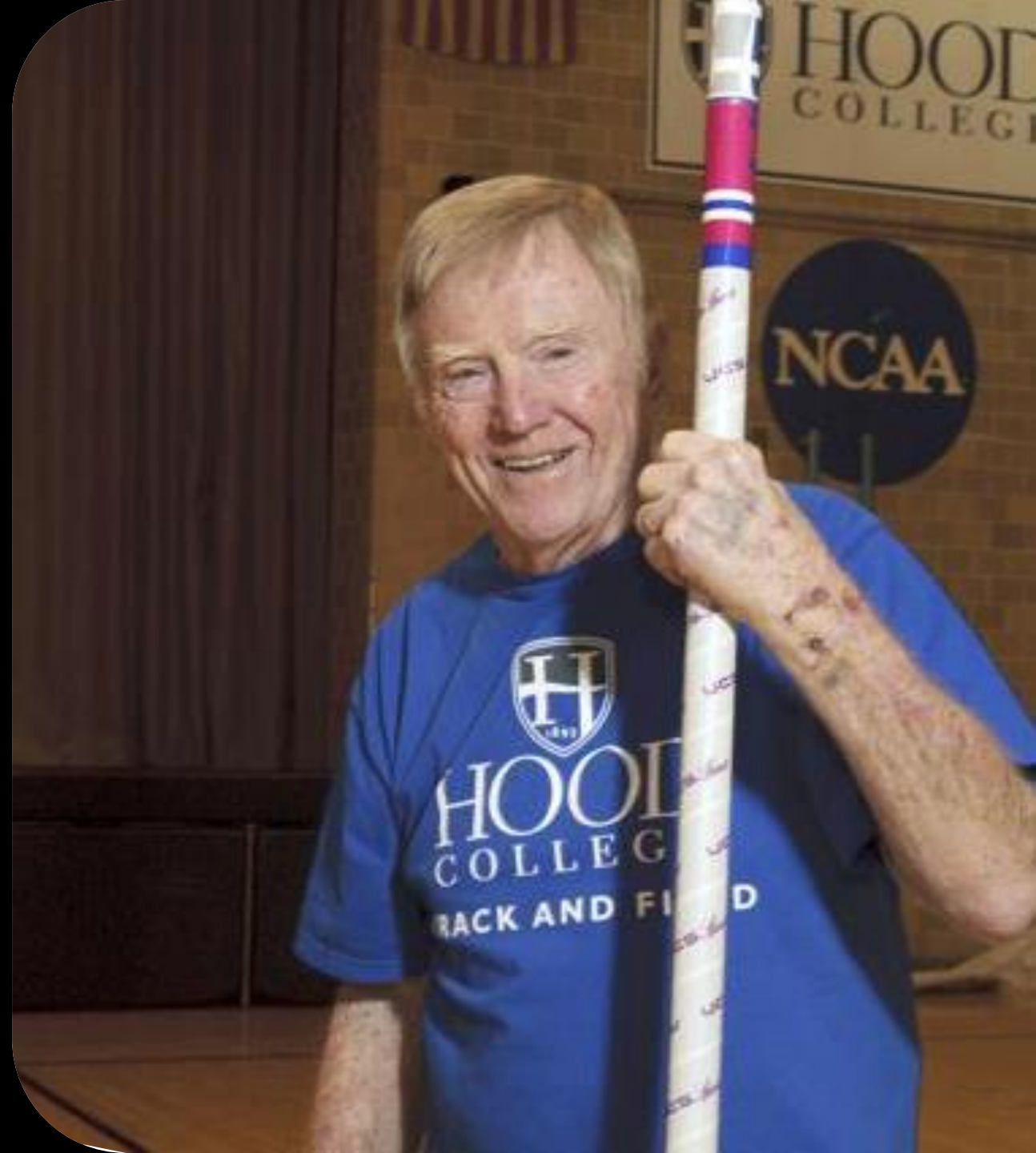
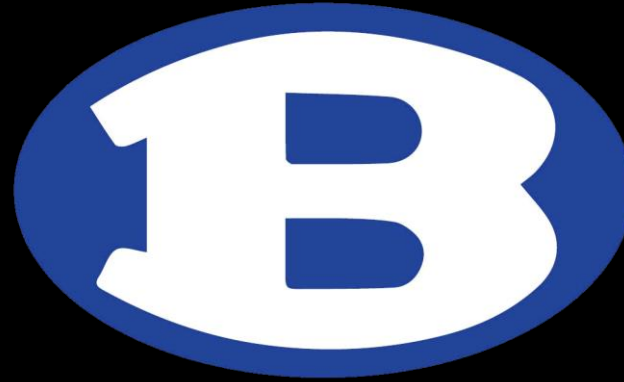

Coach Scott's vision was to bring a comprehensive athletic facility to the campus of Boonsboro High School. The Committee is proposing partnership with the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation in an effort to accomplish the renovations. With this project there are multiple items at play.

- **SAFETY CONCERNS**

- Move Baseball field to location behind tennis courts
- Resurface the Softball field (in conjunction with Baseball move and Title IX efforts)
- Resurface the existing Stadium field for all sports
- Relocate the practice fields displaced by Baseball move
- Expand existing facilities at Stadium with Concessions Stand and Fieldhouse expansions.

THE VISION

Coach Dwight Scott along with Coach Clayton Anders had a vision of providing the athletes of Boonsboro High School the best facilities to showcase their talents and abilities. In brining this vision to life, it will provide student athletes in many of the outdoor sports that use the Stadium, state-of-the-art facilities to compete.

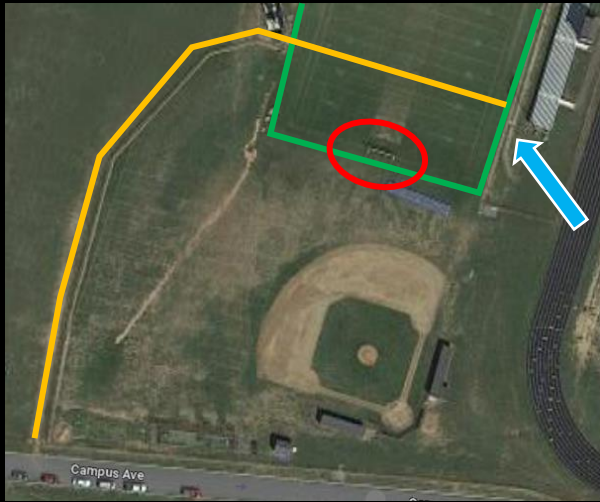

SAFETY CONCERNS



Currently the soccer goal/football goal post sit in the middle of right field. Non-WCPSEmployees currently move the goals at a minimum of 2 times annually presenting a potential liability issue to the school system.

SAFETY CONCERNS

A current storm water ditch runs adjacent to the playing surface and presents a hazard for the students during game-day performances.



SAFETY CONCERNS

A proposed expansion of the current field house facilities is planned to incorporate a new official's room as well as expanded restroom facilities.



This past fall play was suspended in the stadium due to lightning. The contest officials had to sit on the track side of this building under the overhang with limited access to shelter



View from inside stadium. Official's Room will be added to the space (highlighted) for permanent, convenient shelter.



View from outside stadium entrance. In addition to the Official's Room (highlighted in yellow). Additional restroom facilities/access (highlighted in blue) will be added to the space to allow for more access during sporting events such as track or softball. This will eliminate the need for portable facilities as well as opening the stadium, limiting that access and securing its contents.



SAFETY CONCERNS

Currently there are two food vendors in the stadium for events, The BHS Band Boosters and the BHS Athletic Boosters. The current facility does not have the capacity to accommodate both.



Current Athletic Boosters vending area is located in a storage garage for field supplies with service of limited fair. This facility is not set up or designed for food service.



Both food service facilities are within close proximity to each other.



The current concession stand, operated by the Band Boosters is designed for food service however cannot accommodate both organizations due to its size. The highlighted area is where the proposed expansion would occur. This would give both organizations adequate facilities to properly and safely prepare and serve concessions.



SAFETY CONCERNS

Currently there are two food vendors in the stadium for events, The BHS Band Boosters and the BHS Athletic Boosters. The current facility does not have the capacity to accommodate both.



In addition to serving food from a storage garage, the set-up also potentially impedes the ingress and egress for patrons and emergency vehicles



During certain events, the boosters will expand outside the current facility to prepare certain foods by setting up temporary prep areas to manage the volume.



With the expansion, there will be service windows added to the exterior wall so concessions can be run for additional events taking place on campus that do not require the stadium to be opened.

- Several safety issues mitigated
 - Field overlap/Equipment location
 - Cheerleading area is hazardous
 - Official/Staff area for inclement weather
 - Proper food storage and vending
- No WCPS funds allocated to fund any artificial surfaces
- Leverage Title IV opportunities and resources to assist in project completion.
- Budget is all-inclusive
 - Budget accounts for 100% reserves associated with surface replacement 10-years in the future.
 - Project is phased to account for WCPS, County, State and other funding source budgets and multi-year commitments.
